



Children's Hospital Los Angeles Teams with California Poison Control to Host National Poison Prevention Week 2015 Press Briefing

Pediatric Toxicologist, Expert on Poison Exposure, Will Inform and Demonstrate the Dangers of Harmful Household Items

WHAT: California Poison Control and Children's Hospital Los Angeles are observing

National Poison Prevention Week March 15 - 21 with a poison prevention press event at Children's Hospital Los Angeles. Experts will discuss and demonstrate how medications, jewelry, dangerous toys, cleaning products, batteries, plants, pesticides and other seemingly harmless items can lead to poison exposures.

WHY: At Children's Hospital Los Angeles alone, about 58 cases of poison exposure

were seen in 2014. Tragically, because of the lack of proper awareness, about 30 children in the US die every year due to accidental poisonings. Half of the 2 million calls to Poison Help Number in 2011 involved children ages 5 and under.

In fact, 9 out of 10 poisonings occur at home.
